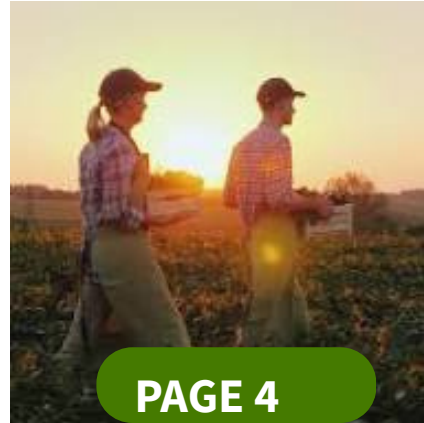

### **Scaling Agroecology across Europe In Practice, Research and Policy**

BRUSSELS – June 24, 2026 — The Agroecology-TRANSECT project will host its final public event in Brussels to reveal breakthrough pathways for sustainable, climate-resilient agriculture across Europe. After four years of intensive, multi-country collaboration, this landmark gathering brings together top researchers, farmers, and policymakers to deliver practical toolkits and proven environmental data .

#### Event Highlights:

- **STREAM-T Tool Launch:** First look at the new co-created multicriteria assesment tool for measuring farm performance
- **11 Innovation Hubs:** Real-world evidence and policy recommendations extracted directly from diverse European farming testbeds
- **Policy Roadmap:** Strategic panel debates mapping future scenarios for the Common Agricultural Policy (CAP)

#### **About Agroecology-TRANSECT**

Agroecology-TRANSECT is a European initiative designed to scale up agroecological practices through a robust science-policy interface. By linking local innovation hubs with high-level policy, the project delivers systemic ecological and climate change transitions.



### Scaling Agroecology across Europe In Practice, Research and Policy

The event agenda is structured around four main sessions that address the challenges and opportunities in the field.

- The first session explores how agroecology integrates agronomic, socio-cultural and political dimensions, and how collaboration between social movements, researchers and practitioners can strengthen transformative change in Europe.

### Biocoop Stefan cel Mare- Agricultural Cooperative



Aurel Petruș, representative of the IH BIO Danubius is an important participant of the Organic Climate Net.

The farm is located in Calarasi county, the farm is known for its successful organic vegetable crops (wheat, rapeseed, corn, soybeans, peas)



**All eggs produced on the Biocoop farm are sold in supermarkets in Romania, and the price difference, compared to conventionally produced eggs, would be double, claims the producer. The farmer has been producing organic crops annually for almost two decades.**
